Dear SITians,

I wish one and all of SIT Family, the best of health, happiness, cheer. I would like to share the progress of the construction work of our OPEN – AIR Auditorium. The structure is complete in all respects and gives a majestic appearance. The cost of construction of the Auditorium was partly met with contribution from our Alumni, allocation of funds from SITAA and from the management of SIT, i.e. Seshasayee Educational Society (SES).

With subsequent financial assistance from SITAA, we have completed the remaining portion of the AUDITORIUM FLOOR with paver blocks and provided a road with paver blocks connecting the main building and the newly built Auditorium.

The works that are to be done to make the entire Auditorium fully functional include construction of side walls, providing doors, windows, providing electrical items and other finishing works. All these works may cost around Rs.35 Lakhs.


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



100 Great IITians: Dedicated to the Service of the Nation

Sahaya Raj

79/Naval Arch/B.Tech (Hons)/ IIT Kharagpur Raaj Saab: The Innovative Ship Builder of Modern India



Almost 50 years ago, a very young boy who had not travelled outside his hometown, set foot on the Campus of IIT Kharagpur. Little did he know that he was blazing a trail from his agricultural roots in his village of Ponmalaipatti in Tamilnadu to a career in naval architecture at one of India's most illustrious institutes. Sahaya Raj was a brilliant student during his studies at Sacred Heart High School and later at Seshasayee Institute at Trichy, which helped him earn the National Merit Scholarship. This helped him pursue his studies at IIT, without any financial burden on his family.

Today, Sahay Raj is the owner and operator of SHOFT - one of India's finest private Shipyards, at the pinnacle of his success.

IIT Kharagpur being the first institute in India to offer the Naval Architecture course, had the best faculty who with great fervour taught the fundamentals about ship design, hydrodynamics, structural engineering, construction, and associated engineering disciplines. Sahay Raj credits his teachers who instilled his love and understanding of the art and science of naval architecture. To this day, he nurtures those relationships, seeking guidance from his KGP teachers.

Kharagpur changed his life in ways unimaginable. With Ltd fluency in English and no knowledge of Bengali, getting through the first few months was itself quite challenging. Luckily, naval architects are naturally buoyant and stable. The survival instincts he developed during his early life at Kharagpur, navigating challenges in hostel life and academic courses, helped him face many tough situations later on in life with confidence. He cherishes the lifelong friendships he developed with wonderful batchmates and hostel mates, who played a major role in nurturing his skills, character, and confidence.







Upon graduation, when a lot of his peers were moving abroad to pursue higher studies, Sahaya Raj chose to stay back and joined the industry to earn and support his family. He landed in Mumbai—the hub of maritime activities and started his career at N N Shipbuilders in September of 1979.

Life wasn't easy in Mumbai but many life skills were learnt—from living in congested accommodations, commuting long distances across the city in crowded buses and trains, and managing numerous hardships. He later moved to Mangala Shipbuilders where he continued to grow his career. The invaluable experience he gained in these private shipyards exposed him to all aspects of shipbuilding, design, fabrication, outfitting, delivery, and most importantly people and financial management.

In 1987, he started on his own, focusing on design consultancy and marine component manufacturing under the name SHOFT (acronym of SHip OutFiT). Soon he diversified to contract shipbuilding by forming a team of experienced professionals and skilled workmen. With their unique capability of working at multiple locations, SHOFT soon emerged as competent contractors for executing shipbuilding jobs in various private and public sector shipyards. During the next twenty years, SHOFT played a substantive collaborative role in the construction of ships built by prominent shipyards across the country.

This brought him close to the industry leaders, many of them alumni of IIT Kharagpur, who ignited his passion for shipbuilding greatly. it was only logical that Sahaya Raj moved to the next level. In 2004, with a modest investment, SHOFT acquired waterfront land on the banks of river Narmada in Bharuch, Gujarat, nine nautical miles from the sea. Over the years, he transformed SHOFT into a medium-sized shipyard with excellent infrastructure and resources. Employing nearly 1200 men, SHOFT has built and repaired more than 100 vessels with many of them being the first of their kind in

India. In recognition, SHOFT was issued the license for building warships by the Ministry of Defence, in 2013. In 2014–15 they built INS Astradharini - A61, the first naval Auxiliary vessel with a weapon outfit built by a private shipyard and commissioned in the Indian Navy.

Around this time, the Government of India promoted the initiative 'Public Private Partnership(PPP)' under the 'Make In India' policy. SHOFT was the early beneficiary and commenced collaborative shipbuilding with the leading DPSU shipyard Mazagaon Dock Ltd, for whom they started building Mega Modular Hull Blocks for Destroyers and Frigates under construction by MDL. These blocks, weighing up to 250 tonnes each were fabricated to warship building standards fitted out at the Bharuch yard and transported to MDL, in Mumbai, by a specially-built barge. They were then assembled to form the full hull, saving substantial construction time. This entire process was so successful that MDL assigned the complete construction of a Destroyer hull to be built at the SHOFT shipyard. This was the first time such a large project was outsourced in India and SHOFT completed the 150m long hull and delivered it to MDL, in record time achieving another milestone for a private shipyard.



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SHOFT shipyard has taken up many ambitious projects and the latest challenge is building twenty RO-RO passenger ferries for the Assam Government for operation in the Brahmaputra River. Due to the lack of local infrastructure, they were built in sections at the shipyard in Bharuch, transported by trailers across the country, and assembled on the banks of the river. Ten such ferries were delivered in 2021–22 and ten more are to be delivered later this year. In the annals of Indian shipbuilding history, there has never been a comparable innovation.

The shipbuilding industry in India has recognized his achievements which led him to spearhead the Shipyards Association of India (SAI) as its President. He is also on the Board of the Indian Register of Shipping. He warmly acknowledges the support of his colleagues, and staff and remains in close touch with the workmen who have been with him right from his early days. He is fondly addressed by all as Raj Saab and remains a humble, humane, and grounded person. He firmly believes in 'Learn, Earn and Return' and SHOFT contributes to CSR and other social causes regularly.

Sahaya Raj remains a true torch-bearer to his profession. Sahaya Raj's ambition is to see India emerge as one of the leading shipbuilding nations like Japan, South Korea, and China and to bring back the glorious days of maritime supremacy of India.

The story of Sahaya Raj should resonate in the hearts and minds of every aspiring Indian. From very adverse circumstances of birth in rural India, he saw potential in himself and steered his career to success. A strong academic foundation is the quintessential need and all it needs is an enquiring mind. With that torch of curiosity, Sahaya Raj made his way to an IIT and then to the footsteps of a career. Having learnt the tools of the shipbuilding trade, he then chose the difficult path of an entrepreneur, with substantive financial and career risk. Fortune, as they say, favours the brave, and Sahaya Raj has been fortunate because of his courage because of his academic rigour, his hard work ethic, and his trust in people. Sahaya Raj truly epitomizes the spirit of 'Make in India'.
